Within 48 hours after Hurricane Ian struck our beautiful shores, we collaborated with the FMB Woman's Club. #WeAreFMB, which started through the efforts of our members to assist people during Covid, transformed into #WeAreFMB Resilient. Combined with the Woman's Club 33931 Fund, we raised over \$800,000 to furnish gift cards to residents of 33931. Yes, **\$800,000** in only three months!

Educational Efforts



We established an endowed scholarship at FSW in 2020. It automatically provides permanent, yearly educational support to people who have lived or worked in the 33931 zip code. These scholarships are not only for traditional degrees but also workforce certificates as well. With funds directly to scholarships for students, we have given 17 to sixteen students (one received it twice.)

Did you know that a recent impact study concluded that FSW has a \$434 million impact on our local economy. Our investment in these students is also an investment in our community.

Our Foundation continues to give students scholarships to other schools as well.


I lived in fort myers beach from 1998-2002 and currently live in fort myers 33912

Our Foundation continues to give students scholarships to other post-secondary and vocational schools as well.






Dr Traci Koaler informed us that next week we'll know if/when the Beach Elementary reopens.

Thank you, **Patti Coleman**, treasurer extraordinaire and answerer of all 33931 digital gift card questions.






2023 Celebration and Awards
